

WHEN THINKING OF MEMORIAL DAY

When taps has sounded over a battlefield cemetery and tired, aching soldiers turn back to their hated task, the same thought fills their minds that fills our minds today, "Why"

Each one of us must someday lose his or her earthly life. Memorial Day we meet in grateful memory of our loved ones and those who gave their lives in defense of our country. probably is that those who give their all on the battlefield hated war, but they hated tyranny even more. They loved their own life, but even more greatly did they love the lives of others. In the defense of our lives and our freedom, they gave up their lives. Jesus said, "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man or woman lay down their life for their friends."

Only if we hold to such a hope, and if we work to turn it into a fact, are we showing adequate thankfulness to those who have fought to give us the opportunity. Count no contribution small that brings a measure of comfort, of justice, of freedom to another human being.

As long as any child lives in fear of bombers flying overhead, as long as any man lives in fear of the secret police, as long as any person lives in the valley of the shadow of tyranny, just so longs does our task remain unfinished.

It is not enough that we should fight for freedom. We must be worthy of it ourselves, and we must offer it to others. That all the thanks we can give to one who gave his last full measure of devotion that we might have the opportunity.
